

Policy 389 Education and Corrections

- 3.1. All individuals and groups affected by the operations of the Department of Corrections. Anyone may have a copy of this policy.

4. Policy

- 4.1. The Department of Corrections adheres to the fundamental belief that education can increase the capability of people to grow and develop by providing them with the knowledge and skills necessary to be responsible and productive members of society. There are inmates in Vermont's correctional facilities who are entitled, under law, to elementary and secondary education. Therefore, it is the responsibility of the Department of Corrections to establish an education capacity which attains and maintains an enrollment that supports a Corrections School.
- 4.2. In order to ensure the provisions of professional educational leadership for the Corrections Education School, the Commissioner of Corrections shall appoint an appropriately licensed Headmaster. The Department of Corrections shall promote and encourage the use of community advisory boards and community based educational services in the operation of the Corrections School. The Corrections School shall promulgate policies, directives and area/work site procedures through the Department of Corrections, to act in accordance with, and to set forth guidelines for, implementation of this policy.
- 4.3. Those policies and procedures shall prohibit and not promote discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex or handicap condition.
