VT Department of Corrections: Segregation Report Fiscal Year 2024 (FY24)

This report contains segregation placement data collected at each Vermont correctional facility throughout the fiscal year listed above. Some information is provided by month and some information is aggregated across the entire fiscal year. Individuals who are in segregation across months are counted for every month in which they were housed in segregation. The information contained in pages 1-4 deliver context and explanation for the data included.

Vermont Segregation Protocols:

The following contains a summary of the information provided in the following hyperlinked Vermont Department of Corrections (VT DOC) policies on segregation placement and procedures: Facility Rules & Inmate Discipline #410.01;

Placement on Administrative Segregation #410.03;

Protective Custody #410.05

It is the policy of the VT DOC to maintain safe, secure, and humane housing for incarcerated individuals who require placement on segregation status. The decision to place an individual in segregation is reviewed by the superintendent of the facility within 24 hours. Administrative Segregation placements of 4 days or longer and all Disciplinary Segregation placements are entitled to a formal hearing (see above directives for more details).

Individuals in segregation can be out of their cells a maximum of 6 hours a day and will maintain access to the following:

- Mental and medical health services (individuals in segregation are monitored by mental health professionals) - Up to 3 books provided by the library - Clothing and hygiene items from the commissary

Special Considerations:

Women are screened by mental health professionals for trauma and abuse history. Additional procedural steps are provided for pregnant and postpartum women. Segregation placements for individuals with Serious Functional Impairments (SFI) must follow the departmental policy and rule: Classification, Treatment and the Use of Administrative and Disciplinary Segregation for Inmates with a Serious Mental Illness #370 (see page 3 of this report for more details).

- Showers

- Individual exercise (includes outdoor, weather permitting)


- Individual out-of-cell programming (e.g., education, Open Ears)

- 1 social visit a week

- 1-3 social phone calls a week









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Administrative Segregation: A form of separation from the general population when the continued presence of the incarcerated individual in the general population (GP) would pose a serious threat to life, property, self, staff, or other incarcerated individuals or to the security (e.g., escape planning) or orderly running of the institution (e.g., chronic, repetitive discipline problem). Individuals pending investigation for trial on a criminal act or pending transfer may also be included if they pose a threat. Disciplinary Segregation: A form of separation from the general population in which inmates committing serious violations of conduct regulations are confined for short periods of time to individual cells separated from the general population. Placement in Disciplinary Segregation may only occur after finding of a rule violation at an impartial hearing and when there is not an adequate alternative disposition to regulate the individual's behavior.


<u>Reasons for Segregation Placement:</u>

- -Civil Confinement/Contempt: Separation of a person imprisoned for contempt of court or to enforce an order of the court
- -Close Custody: The highest security level classification for an incarcerated individual which requires separation from the general population. Facilities that don't have a Close Custody Unit place individuals in Administrative Segregation for separation from the general population.
 - -Danger to Others: The individual poses a danger to other incarcerated individuals or staff
 - -Dry Cell Placement: Individual is placed in segregation to remove contraband that the individual smuggled into the facility
 - -Escape Risk: There is reason to believe the individual may escape if not placed in segregation (due to prior attempts and/or threats)
 - -Pending Investigation: Individual is placed in segregation pending an investigation regarding their actions/behavior
 - -Pre-Hearing Disciplinary Segregation Placement: Segregation placement pending the results of the Disciplinary Segregation hearing
 - -Protected Custody: Placement in segregation at the request of the incarcerated individual or facility staff for the safety of the individual
 - -Refusing GP Placement: Individual is placed in segregation due to refusing their general population housing placement or will not leave segregation
- -Threat to Security/Running of Facility: Segregation placement due to behavior/actions of individual that pose a threat to the security and/or operations of facility
- -Violated a VT DOC Rule: Individual placed in segregation due to violating a VT DOC rule. This can include: disrupting facility operations, violating a rule that was violent in nature, or "other" to capture any other type of rule violation

Types of Segregation:

-Bed Space: No general population beds available (rare)









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<u>Serious Functional Impairment (SFI):</u>

Serious Functional Impairment (SFI) is defined as:

a) A substantial disorder of thought, mood, perception, orientation, or memory, any of as diagnosed by a qualified mental health professional, which grossly substantially impairs judgment, behavior, capacity to recognize reality, or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, and which substantially impairs the ability to function within the correctional setting; or b) a developmental disability, traumatic brain injury or other organic brain disorder, or various forms of dementia or other neurological disorder as diagnosed by a qualified mental health professional, which substantially impairs the ability to function in the correctional setting.

An offender can be designated as SFI through two distinct processes:

1) Designation by a qualified mental health professional as a result of a clinical and functional assessment; or

2) Designation as a result of an administrative process which confirms the offender was receiving developmental services (community rehabilitation and treatment, developmental disability, traumatic brain injury, and/or cognitive-functional composite) upon entering VT DOC custody through verifying/validating the inmates' pre-existing and active communitybased waiver(s).

Additional Segregation Procedures for Individuals with a Serious Functional Impairment:


Any use of segregation for SFI-designated individuals shall be in accordance with the following hyperlinked departmental policy and rule: Classification, Treatment and the Use of Administrative and Disciplinary Segregation for Inmates with a Serious Mental Illness #370.

SFI-Designated individuals shall be screened for <u>contraindications</u> prior to placement in Administrative or Disciplinary Segregation.

All mental health and health services rounds in segregation for SFI-designated individuals will occur as required by the above VT DOC rule #370. An SFIdesignated individual shall be seen daily by mental health staff. These visits shall be documented in the individual's electronic health records.


An SFI-designated individual shall not be kept in Disciplinary Segregation for more than 15 calendar days.

All alternative options shall be considered and documented in the individual's electronic health records prior to placing an individual with an SFI designation in segregation.



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Race/Ethnicity Data:

In this report, race data are categorized as follows: -American Indian/Alaskan Native: "AmerIndian/ AlaskanNative" -Asian/ Pacific Islander: "Asian/ PacIslander" -Black or African American: "Black" -White: "White" -Some Other Race: "Other"

Some race categories are combined due to the low number of individuals who identify with these races. In some instances, individuals who identify as American Indian/Alaskan Native, Asian, Black or African American, and/or Pacific Islander were combined and indicated by the acronym "BIPOC", which means Black, Indigenous, and people of color.

Hispanic, Latinx, or Spanish Identification is captured with a separate yes/no response.

Both Race and Hispanic, Latinx, or Spanish Identification require a selection.

Gender Data:

In this report, gender data are categorized as follows: -Cisgender Female: Sex female, identifies female ("Female") -Cisgender Male: Sex male, identifies male ("Male") -Transgender Female: Sex male, identifies female ("Transgender")

-Transgender Male: Sex female, identifies male ("Transgender") -Intersex: A term referring to people who have physical markers that differ from the medical definitions of male or female ("Intersex")

NOTE: Transgender Female, Transgender Male, Intersex, and Other were combined into one category: "Transgender & Other" for this report due to low numbers of individuals who identify with these genders. 





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




FY SFI Designated Only: Segregation Placements







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FY SFI Designation Only: Segregation Placements-Needed Medical Care in Segregation



FY24 Unique Individuals in Segregation by Age*








FY24 Unique Individuals: Type of Segregation Placement by Hispanic/Latinx/Spanish Identification
