What is the Prison Research and Innovation Network (PRIN)?

Our presence in Southern State Correctional Facility (SSCF) is part of a five-year research project, funded by Arnold Ventures, to promote the well-being of people who live and work in this prison. The PRIN is a national effort that includes five research sites: Colorado, Delaware, Iowa, Missouri, and Vermont.

Goals:

- Understand prison environments and the safety and well-being of those who live and work there.
- Help prisons collect data to promote transparency and accountability.
- Support evidence-based changes to improve prisons, such as ensuring safe and humane environments for all.

In pursuit of these goals, **this project will enlist the input of people confined and working in SSCF in the research study design, review of findings, and development of recommendations for improvements.**

Who We Are

Our team consists of members of the University of Vermont (UVM) and the Urban Institute (Urban). UVM is the premier research institution in Vermont, with extensive resources in research study design and broad faculty and student research experience. The UVM project team consists of faculty from the Justice Research Initiative (JRI), an interdisciplinary research group focused on justice research.

Urban is a non-profit research organization located in Washington D.C. The project team consists of researchers from Urban's Justice Policy Center, which aims to inform solutions to all manners of crime and safety challenges, using research to lift the voices, experiences, and perspectives of the people, practitioners, and communities most affected by crime and the criminal justice system.
