## **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this policy is to establish the procedure the Department of Corrections (DOC) shall follow when an inmate requests to marry while in a correctional facility.

## **PHILOSOPHY**

It is the philosophy of the DOC that strong relationships, including romantic relationships, can have a meaningful impact on the life of an inmate. The DOC believes that positive relationships and strong familial ties are important to the rehabilitation of an offender.

#### **POLICY**

It is the policy of the DOC to review all requests by inmates to marry on a case by case basis. This review shall verify that both parties are legally eligible to wed, and assess any safety or security concerns that may impact either of the parties getting married, or the correctional facility. All requests for marriage shall be reviewed by the inmate's assigned Corrections Services Specialist (CSS), the Superintendent of the facility, and the Commissioner of DOC. DOC shall allow inmates who would like

to attend some form of pre-marital counseling to meet with a religious leader or other counselor.

An inmate may wed another inmate, however married inmates shall not be housed together. Conjugal visits shall not be permitted and no allowances for additional correspondence, visits, or property shall be made for married inmates.

Inmates, or their intended spouse, shall be responsible for any and all costs associated with the marriage and ceremony.
